#### "Zero Waste" Pot Luck Lunch

April 8th

Everyone is invited, and all are welcome to join us on Sunday, April 8th following worship for a pot luck lunch to introduce Caring for Creation, part of our environmental initiative to reduce waste and tread lightly on our earth. Our goal at this lunch is to have NOTHING in our garbage cans, and to have everything at the event be reusable, recyclable or compostable!

Ron Schulhof and Michelle Sterling will be here to introduce Zero Waste to our congregation. They will share what other houses of worship in Westchester have done to reduce waste. They will also speak about the municipal/residential food scrap recycling program that has been instituted in Scarsdale. Through this program residents can now collect their food scraps at home and bring them to a spot in the town where they get carted off-site and turned into compost.

Ron and Michelle partnered with their town, starting the program in January 2017, and it has been a huge success. In fact, several other Westchester towns have started it as well, and many are on the cusp. Pleasantville has expressed interest in starting a site for our residents and Pleasantville officials including the mayor, Peter Scherer, have

# News from our Scholarship Committee

As a means of encouraging church members to donate to the church's scholarship fund, last month's newsletter printed a note from a scholarship recipient which expressed his/her appreciation for the award and how much it has meant to him/her.

Here is some information designed to further encourage donations, This data is from 2015 (more current data is not yet available, but it most likely hasn't gone down :) "The average annual increase in college tuition from 1980-2014 grew by nearly 260% compared to the nearly 120% increase in all consumer items. In 1980, the average annual cost of tuition, room and board, and fees at a four-year post-secondary institution was \$9,438, according to the Department of Education. That number has since climbed to \$23.872."

Each year, the Scholarship Committee receives requests for aid; consequently, we need your help in replenishing our funds. Please think about making a donation to help our students-checks may be made out to the Pleasantville Presbyterian Church with "Scholarship Fund" noted in the memo. Many thanks!
