# Pastor Debbie on "What good shall I do this day?"

Dear Friends in Christ,

I've been reading a little about Benjamin Franklin lately, and have been fascinated. I knew the stories of his great intellect, the difference he made with his science, his service to the country, and his less than appropriate behavior. What I did not know about what was the daily practice that was his process throughout life.

As a young man, he decided to aim for moral perfection - a goal he knew he would not achieve. But - he came to believe that the journey toward this goal would make for the kind of life he wanted to live.

The key to his practice? Beginning every day with the question "What good shall I do this day?" And ending each day by reflecting on the question "What good did I do this day?"

How would it change our lives to engage in this kind of reflective practice? The Ignatian Examen is a spiritual practice that has stood the test of centuries.

Ask God for light: I want to look at my day with God's eyes, not merely my own.

Give thanks: The day I have just lived is a gift from God. Be grateful for it.

Review the day: I carefully look back on the day just completed, being guided by the Holy Spirit.

Face your shortcomings: I face up to what is wrong—in my life and in me.

Look toward the day to come: I ask where I need God in the day to come.

May we learn and grow in our lives, through taking the time to reflect on who and whose we are - and how we are living the life we've been given.

What to donate...

Please be selective about what you donate as many people count on Rummage to provide basic needed items or to enjoy items beyond their budgets. You can show compassion by sharing (donating) your gently used, but no longer needed possessions.

Please don't bring....

However please don't bring tires, bathroom/kitchen components, exercise equipment, ski equipment, really big household items/furniture, computers, TVs, infant equipment such as cribs, car seats, swings, play yards, and non-working, incomplete, or broken items.

Most helpful donors...

If you have ever dropped off items for Rummage you can appreciate the monumental job faced by our sorters. Please pre-sort and mark your donated items. Group items in the categories: linens, household, holiday, books, toys, sports equipment and separately place the groups in labelled boxes.
