Pastor Debbie on Lent is the Church's Springtime!

Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the joys of following the liturgical calendar as a spiritual practice is be intentional about how we approach the seasons of the church year. What is Lent – and what does it mean to us to participate in the season of Lent?

The church first popularized the season of Lent in the fourth century, а time as traditionally associated with giving things up – fasting and penitence, balanced by giving things to - almsgiving to those in need, and prayer for us and for all people. The idea of giving things up can feel negative – but Lent is not supposed to be negative. It is supposed to be an opportunity. In the words of the Lenten Devotional "Bread and Wine," "Lent is supposed to be the church's springtime, a time when, out of the darkness of sin's winter, a repentant, empowered people emerges...Lent is a time to let go of excuses for failing and shortcomings.... a time to ask God to show us what we really look like."

Still – facing our need for repentance doesn't have to feel as if we've been deserted. We are always in the presence of the God who so loved the world that Jesus lived, died and rose again in love of us -to overcome all sin, and all separation from God. We are free. And in our freedom, we get to choose again and again to look for Springtime in our lives – and start a brand new day.

For many people the way to celebrate Lent is by adding something to our discipleship journey. A devotional, a Bible study, a way of serving God - all the things that help us see beyond ourselves to a new day in Christ they are ways to celebrate Lent. You'll see some opportunities within these pages. If you need more ideas, I'd be glad to point you toward some possibilities that might meet you where you are and help you grow in your faith. What can you say yes to this Lenten season?

Stewardship and Special Offerings Update

We are pleased to report that we have 8 new pledgers this year. Nearly 50% of all promises pledged "stepped up" over last year, a total increase of 5%.

In 2015, One Great Hour of Sharing, Pentecost, The Peace and Global Witness, Thanksgiving and Christmas Joy Offerings raised a combined \$3,656. 25% of the Peace and Global Witness Offering (\$233.75) was retained to support our Youth Social Justice Internship program here at Pleasantville Presbyterian as was 40% (\$272.40) of the Pentecost Offering.


