#### **Solar Energy Comes to Pleasantville Presbyterian**

We are excited to announce the solar panel array on the roof of the CE Building supplying energy to both the sanctuary and the CE Building is now up and running! We have 115 panels, a system size of 37.6 kilowatts (kW) producing an estimated 44,206 kilowatt hours (kWhs) per

year. The panels and the inverters (that convert the solar power to electricity) have a 20-25 year warranty. We are grateful that we can be a leader in our community bringing environmental awareness to all. Thanks to everyone who worked to accomplish this project.

### "Remembering our Past Through Christian Theology"

### Pastor Debbie on Asking for a Spiritual Coat

As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God?

Psalm 42:1-2

Dear Friends in Christ.

So it's freezing today as I write this note to you. As cold as I can ever remember it being. Yet outside in the hallway a very adorable three-year-old is telling his Dad that he doesn't need a coat – because he's not cold – he's never cold.

It seems that three-year-olds are endowed with a sense of stubborn independence, that doesn't want to want or need anything. And I feel as though that is one part of being three that most of us don't totally outgrow. Too often we don't want to need anything, physically, emotionally, mentally – we want to be independent. To be okay on our own.

So finding our way to be spiritually interdependent might be a lot harder than we want to admit. To know that we need God – that our soul's get thirsty for God – is this something you find easy to say to yourself – or is our spiritual need as difficult to accept as our other needs?

This year – we are blessed with a longer season of epiphany – because Easter is late in April. That means more time to consider how the light of Christ is trying to light up our lives – to become aware of the leadings of the Spirit of God, as they show us new ways to be in our world.

May we open ourselves up to hear our own soul's discovering what they need – and give them the soul food they are looking for.

First, a little trip back through history. The cornerstone for our church was laid on November 2, 1880. We held our first public worship on July 17, 1881 (now in our 138<sup>th</sup> year). The Church building has been rebuilt and enlarged three times, and in 1923, the orientation of the sanctuary went from the eastern side of the building (where you can still see the Rose Window from the outside) to the present day southern side.

In our recent history, we have made major capital improvements and additions about every 10 years. The CE building was built in 1963, and the Carriage House was refurbished in the late 60's. In the 70's our sanctuary was redesigned and refurbished, including relocation of the organ. In 1980, Mrs. Wallace (Reader's Digest) donated capital to rebuild that organ. Sanctuary roof and ceiling repairs along with the installation of ceiling fans took place in the 80's. The 90's saw the replacement of the heating system. In the early 2000's we replaced the kitchen and renovated Fellowship Hall, our foyer and the Manse. In 2010 we completed a new roof on the Sanctuary. (cont'd on pg. 4)

#### **God the Taxi Driver**

Taxi! Taxi! Taxi!" Everyday we exercise faith in something or someone, without giving it much thought. Why? Because we think we are in control of the situation.

The cab pulls up and we enter. We don't know anything at all about the driver. Do we ask his name or do we take note of the license plate or number of the vehicle? Really! Why go through all that trouble? The cab company took our call and sent the driver. That's good enough.

But here's the thing. Although we don't know anything about the driver, we trust him to take us safely to our destination and if he doesn't know the way, GPS will guide him. So we sit back and relax. That's faith. That is just one of the many situations in our daily life where we place our faith in someone.

Sometimes the ride is not a smooth one. Up ahead traffic is at a standstill. Why? There's been an accident. Delay. Sometimes construction work on the road. Delay. An obstacle in the road, again delay, a detour resulting in a longer journey. Oh, and then that time of the year the state troopers are out in force. Groans...delays. We'll be late but we will get there. That's faith.

How is it with us and our faith in God? To place our faith in God is sometimes hard to do because we are being asked to believe in a God we cannot see and to give control of our lives and plans to Him.

But the Bible says "He that cometh to God must believe that He is." (Heb 55:0); and "Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of

God."(Romans54:5¹) To come to that place of faith, we have to believe the word of God. Various scriptures encourage us to believe in God. Let us look at a few more here: "For He hath said, I will never leave you or forsake you."(Hebrews 57:9) "And the man believed the word that Jesus had spoken to him and he went his way."(John 8:94) "So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return to me void."(Isaiah 55:11) "I am the way, the truth and the life."(John 14:6) "In the world you shall have tribulations: but be of good cheer I have overcome the world."(John 16:33)

I know the way. You can place your faith in me. I'll take you there safely all the way up to heaven. Gates of pearls and streets of gold. How about that? Hallelujah! Wow!
