Social Justice Film Screening and Dialogue Recap

Social justice in action! Ten members of the congregation joined the larger community for a screening of "The Feeling of Being Watched," at the Jacob Burns Theater in December. A documentary of an Arab-American Chicago-based neighborhood that fell under heavy government surveillance prior to 9/11, the film was an empowering and timely reminder that individuals with a clear-eyed vision of the good life can initiate positive change in their slice of the world.

Highlighting Assia's mother, neighbors, family, and members of her faith community, the film was also a testament to the power and importance of supportive community in the lives of these change-makers. In addition, the film was posed as a prompt to the audience – asking us to resist passivity, call out injustice as we see it and work for a more fair and equitable world.

POP Update for 2018

We are thankful for all the pledges we received in 2018 toward year two of the Preserve Our Property (POP) Campaign. It's not too late for you to fulfill your pledge for this year or to add a new pledge! Some highlights of what's in progress or been completed in 2018 include:

- a brand new roof on the Christian Education (CE) building
- rooftop Solar Panels to power the Sanctuary and the CE Building
- exterior repainting and repairing of the CE wing
- landscaping and mulch around the sanctuary and manse
- new Bride's Room doors in the sanctuary,
- front gable repair and new paint and curtains at the manse and
- interior and exterior repairs and upgrades in the carriage house including landscaping and new steps and doors.

In 2019 we will turn our attention to projects that continue improving the integrity and infrastructure of our properties, the largest being repaving our parking lot. The POP Committee wants to thank everyone who has helped and is helping us to move forward into year three.
