POP Update

With your support of the Preserve Our Property campaign, our properties have benefited from some love. You will recall that the very first expense pursued by the POP committee, back in 2015, was to obtain a professional prioritization of all the needs across our "five" properties: (1) the Church, (2) the Christian Education wing, (3) the Carriage House, (4) the Manse, and (5) the church Grounds. The great news is that our highest priority projects will all have been addressed by the end of 2019. Where necessary, we hired a contractor to complete the projects, and where possible, we leveraged volunteer labor.

Of course, there are important projects we still hope to tackle, most notably, correcting our drainage issues and then repaving our parking lot. There are other valuable and meaningful projects still to be accomplished.
