Preserve Our Property

Our committee reviewed the architect's report after a full assessment of the church, carriage house and manse. Based on their recommendations we have identified 3 main areas as immediate priorities:

- 1. Women's bathroom renovation
- 2. Water entry control project and window restoration
- 3. Zoning of heating system and centralization of controls

The bathroom will be renovated in July and August while Great Beginnings is on break. We are in the process of obtaining bids to do the work, and eliciting ideas from women (and men!) who may have input to share. This project will be funded from the contributions we have already received. We are exploring the water and heating issues to decide the best pathways to repair and restoration. Our fundraising efforts will be determined as we continue this process. Stay tuned! Any early contributions you wish to offer for the ongoing projects are welcomed, please put "POP" in the memo section of your check or online gift.
