

Women's Brunch Features an Inspiring Talk by Christine Alvis



On Saturday morning, Susana Corona (skillfully assisted by Alma) hosted a delicious and soul-satisfying Presbyterian women's brunch that featured Christine Alvis presenting on her inspiring spiritual journey. We had 40 women and girls, spanning at least 80 years in age, who tried their best but didn't quite manage to finish the abundance of delicious food, which included many different kinds of quiches, salads, breads, and desserts.

After a lovely half hour of gastronomy and fellowship -- during which my end of the table was treated to a fascinating account of Daisy's college trip to Cuba -- we made ourselves comfortable to hear the featured presentation.

Christine's story was gripping and beautiful, weaving together inspiration and

love from the multiple religious traditions that make up her identity: Judaism and Catholicism from childhood, Zen Buddhism from college, nuns from Nursing school, and finally a Presbyterian husband (and belated discovery of her mother's unlikely early confirmation as Presbyterian too!). Christine shared her moving personal history of many griefs and losses -- though balanced by inspiring instances of human connection and of triumph over suffering -- and we also learned about her professional life spent in the borderlands between life and death, caring for her fellow humans in extreme need, first in a pioneering neo-natal intensive care unit and then, at the other end of the life cycle, in a nursing home.

In Pleasantville, grateful for a growing family, a spiritually supportive and loving community, and three wonderful pastors, Christine has involved herself in countless aspects of this church's work, nearly always, as she pointed out, because someone came to her with a request. In conclusion, she encouraged us all to reach out and invite people to participate, and also to keep an open mind ourselves when invited by someone else.

I'm sure it will go well although she will need a bit of luck to overcome the handicap of not having Christine Alvis to do the presentation and Susana Corona to organize the occasion! All in all, it was a wonderful morning of warmth and nourishment for body and soul.


