Pastor Debbie on Telling Stories


Dear Friends.

"Collateral Damage - Changing the Conversation about Firearms and Faith"

This groundbreaking new book by James E. Atwood, pastor emeritus of Trinity Presbyterian Church in Arlington, Virginia, comes out in bookstores nationwide on November 5th. In his third book on gun violence, Atwood takes us beyond the headlines into the rippling impact of gun violence on survivors, families, children, our economy, and the long-term collateral damage of gun violence for all of us, with excellent documentation and new sources of information.

Please fill your bag and return to church by **Sunday, November 10th.**



The chancel choir under the leadership of Dave Macdonald and the instrumentalism of Evan Closser offers a range of great anthems ranging from African-American spirituals through jazz and pop to Bach, Beethoven and Mozart. The handbell choir provides wonderful regular and frequent music. We in the congregation enthusiastically join in hymn singing.

We love to

- Sunday school has educated our children in Christianity for years.
- Grownups and young people journey to West Virginia and eastern Kentucky to put hammer, saw and nail to houses there to make them warmer, sturdier and safer as part of the Appalachia Service Project, a twenty-year endeavor for our church. The Christmas in Appalachia program augments ASP with gifts to needy families in the region.
- Great Beginnings Pre-School has taught kids starting out in life for years.
- Men's and Women's Bible study is a source of education and fellowship.
- English classes every Friday night teach ESL students in the area; and a dedicated group of congregants has found education and fellowship in the Spanish classes held every Thursday night. More students are encouraged for both classes!
- The annual rummage sale has long been an important source of revenue and cooperative companionship.
- The community dinners, started early this year, are joyful and well attended.
- Four young people have wonderfully served our fellowship under our Associates program, begun last year.

We know there are still more stories to tell. And to be able to tell them and the ones above in the future as proudly as we have told them in the past, we need the continued generous financial support of all of us. Shortly we will be receiving communications with more information of what we have all been doing, and affording us all the opportunity to provide that support. We look forward to another year when, once again, we will be happy to say, "we love to tell the story."


