Should We Tithe?

Talking about tithing causes mixed reactions. Some people who tithe believe they are better off because they give. A non-tither may think that tithers give *because* they are better off. Whatever our perspective, tithing is a practice that appears throughout the pages of Scripture.

So why don't we tithe? The top reason is that we don't trust God enough. We worry that there won't be enough money to pay the bills. Or filled with the busy-ness of our lives, we forget that all we are and all we have are gifts from God. Or perhaps we simply don't see giving as a priority or a regular discipline. We pay our bills and then give from what is leftover. Tithing asks the question: who comes first? Tithing is a statement of faith. Through faith we change our attitude about giving as an obligation, to giving as a joyful opportunity to express love and loyalty to God. A lot of things compete for our money, and God wants His people to put Him first.

Christianity in Qatar

We have now attended the Anglican worship services several times. We are impressed by the determination of so many people to attend worship, braving arcane traffic patterns and crowds and security scanners and very long walks in unshaded sunny heat.

What is officially marked "Religions Complex" but unofficially called Religion City, is the square mile given to all Christians to build their houses of worship. The Anglican Center serves the Protestant community, with over 30 different groups and 15,000 people worshiping in various parts of the building throughout the weekend. One neighboring building houses the Indian Inter-Denominational Christian Church (the several branches of the ancient Keralan Orthodox church), while the largest building is the Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Probably the two largest expatriate groups in Qatar are from India and the Philippines. Within the same complex are also Coptic and Greek and Syrian Orthodox churches. It does seem ironic that the local police last summer drastically tightened security, making it quite a

chore to get to church, with no vehicles and only two pedestrian entrances, with X-ray scanners and metal detectors and anti-tank barriers. That certainly appears discouraging, and yet thousands of people politely and eagerly flock there on Fridays, overflowing the large parking lot. In the midst of a conservative Islamic country, the expatriates are determined to gather together to exercise their right to distinctive worship.

The Anglican service is a delightful mixture of old (robes, procession, communion rail) and new (praise hymns, varied responses). worshipping community is the most amazingly diverse we have ever seen -- U.S., Canadian, English, Australian, South African, Nigerian, Kenyan, Jamaican, Asian. At one service, a baby was baptized with the liturgy partially in Maori, and a choir sang the offertory hymn in Swahili. We like the group, though we plan to visit other (more specifically American) Protestant services in the next few weeks as Next time, more about the development of the Anglican Center and Religion City.

Tithing

(cont' from pg. 5) Five ways we will benefit when we give 10% or more of our income to God's work:

- 1. We will strengthen our trust in God and help further our spiritual growth.
- 2. We will experience God's creative care in meeting our needs.
- 3. We will break from feelings of poverty.
- 4. We will store up treasure in heaven.
- 5. We will help our church to better serve us and others.

And if that's not convincing enough, researchers compared tithers to non-tithers using nine financial health indicators, and found that tithers were better off in every category. Among tithers, for example, 80 percent have no unpaid credit card bills, 74 percent don't owe anything on their cars, 48 percent own their home and 28 percent are debt-free. This year, pray about what it would mean to intentionally tithe. Imagine all we could do if everyone would.
