Pastor Debbie on Reading the Story in Different Ways

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we prepared for teacher training this fall, we decided one of the things that would be good for the group to experience would be some Bible study formats that could be used with a variety of passages as a supplement to our curriculum.

Some folks said they thought these would be fun for everyone to have to try on their own, or in their group Bible studies:

Bible Study Supplements

1. Invite the participants to imagine themselves in the story:

- Begin by setting the scene who is there, where is it happening.
- Use their senses to see, hear, smell, taste, and feel what is happening.
- Close their eyes see the scene and listen.
- How did it change the story to see yourself in it?

Midnight Run



Our congregation participates in the Midnight Run which is a ministry to those who are currently homeless in NYC. The date of the next Run is November 18th, Donations of gently used clothing are always appreciated and may be dropped off in the large white bin in the downstairs hallway. If you would like to go on a Run or have other questions, talk with Dave Smutzler. 2. Look at the passage and write down all the verbs – the action words. Look at the list and ask yourself:

- What's happening?
- What is Jesus doing?
- Does this tell me anything about what I can be doing in my life?

3. Modern Art - Draw the story while you hear it read – not so much in images from the story (although that's fine too) but more in lines, shapes, dots – mountains and waves:

- What do you experience when you see what you've drawn?
- Does it help you to hear God's word to respond with art?

There's always more to learn from studying God's word!

- 4. Ship your gift by Thanksgiving.


